



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ABOUT US

The altruistic activities in the areas of education, healthcare and sociocare are carried out under the following trusts and society. These institutions are managed independently, each by a separate Board of Trustees and governed by the statute under which they are set up. They are, however, united in purpose of extending loving service and contributing to nation building.

SRI SATHYA SAI LOKA SEVA TRUST

Known previously as the Loka Seva Vrinda, the Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Trust was registered at Chikkaballapur in 1978 to run the two educational campuses in Alike (Dakshin Kannada district) and Muddenahalli

in Chikkaballapur district. Together, these two campuses run nine institutions that impart primary, higher primary and secondary education including pre-university and degree courses.

PRASHANTHI BALA MANDIRA TRUST

This trust was set up in 1981 at Chikkaballapur to offer education that aims to mould children to excel in academics and cultivate a holistic personality. The following schools are managed by this trust:

- b) Sri Sathya Sai Sathya Niketanam, Hassan
- c) Sri Sathya Sai Vani Niketanam, Gadag

This institution was established in the year 2011 with alumni of the Sathya Sai Educational Institutions as trustees. Registered in Karnataka's Chikkaballapur district, the trust defines its purpose as being able to offer free, values-based

education to children. The Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Niketanam in Gulbarga, the Sri Sathya Sai Sharada Niketanam in Mandya and both Sri Sathya Sai Divya Niketanam and Sri Sathya Sai Sri Niketanam in Chikamagalur district are run by this trust.

This trust was set up in the year 2014 and was registered in Chikkaballapur district, Karnataka as a religious trust under the Charitable and

Religious Trusts Act 1920. All yajnas, pujas, religious and spiritual talks by learned scholars are organised and conducted by this trust.

This society was registered in 2012 at Mandya district, Karnataka as the Loka Seva Trust's books, publication and communications division. Through several


books, event updates at Muddenahalli and Sanathana Vani, the radio channel, this arm communicates Baba's message of unity of religions and loving service.

In 1982, when we established the first school for girls in Chikkaballapur district, I couldn't have imagined we would be schooling 4,600 students across 22 institutions and nine districts in Karnataka. Yet, just one in ten such students living in countrified India makes her way to our schools. This explains not just our hurried expansion to integrate more children into the formal schooling system but also the criticality of it.

As an institution committed to moulding students to be socially responsible, academically brilliant and fundamentally of strong character, we believe valuesbased education is vital to human and economic development. So, alongside enabling our little learners to eke a living, we also equip them with skills to make life worthwhile and meaningful.

That the students leave the portals seeing themselves as contributors to the society inspires us to stay invested in this cause. And when we look back after handing over each batch to the society, we realise that this process of teaching and learning has touched and transformed us as much as it has the students. May be that's why they say when one teaches, two learn.

The past year has been very gratifying for us with all our schools reporting a 100 percent pass percentage in both English and Kannada media of instruction. Also, we embraced more students this year adding two campuses at Gadag and Chikkaballapur districts. And this has been possible because many have made benevolence their bent of mind, parting with their rainy-day funds to bestow children with the wealth of education.

Until the last child from our country's villages receives education and her children do too, we will keep at it.





Our schools offer courses from the primary to higher secondary levels across the Central Board as well as State Board and in English and Kannada medium.



VIS-À-VIS STATE AVERAGES


STATE BOARD

^{*}percentage of students with 85 per cent or above in aggregate score


CBSE X CLASS SCORECARD (PASS%)






























FACULTY EXCELLENCE

ALUMNI EXCELLENCE

The alumni of the Sri Sathya Sai Educational Institutions form an important part of the growth and sustainability story of our institutions. Their involvement ranges from providing financial sustenance to bringing skills and support from outside to introduce best practices in the campuses. The alumni are also actively involved in counselling and mentoring the current students.

The alumni bring expertise and know-how from within and without the community in areas such as eco-sustainability, green initiatives, water conservation, skill development & personality development. These engagements offer a valuable opportunity for the students to engage with people from diverse walks of lives, providing them with the much-required exposure to facets of life which aid in their wholesome development.

INTEGRAL TO THE SYSTEM AND HOLISTIC IN ITS ENGAGEMENT



Education is the single best way to help people help themselves. Yet, as a nation, we underinvest in education. Each One Educate One (e1e1) is a step towards bridging this gap. It is a movement, led by the Sathya Sai Institutions' alumni and like-minded individuals, to spread the transformative gift of education to the rural hinterlands of our country.

GOING GREEN

This alumni-driven initiative is all about helping create a campus-wide culture of conservation. Nature conservation is a big part of the work. During the year the alumni and students work together in increasing the green cover in campuses by planting trees and setting up best practices in water conservation. Many of our campuses are in arid and dry regions, and these initiatives have helped them become self-sufficient and self-sustaining with regard to their water usage. In the Gulbarga, Hassan and Mandya campuses, for example, the alumni body led the efforts for a bore well recharge and built storage tanks.

To ensure sustainability of these programmes, eco clubs are being set up in each campus.

Students who enrol in these clubs will spearhead the green initiative and ensure its continuity.









GREEN POWER

With an objective to reduce carbon emission and cut back on usage of power produced by fossil fuels, the schools have embarked on using renewable energy to power up their classrooms and dormitories. About 455 Metric Tons of carbon emissions on a yearly basis can be reduced, which in carbon dioxide absorbing

capacity is equivalent to growing 12,000 trees. Thus far, the Muddenahalli campus has an installed capacity of 450 KWP with rooftop solar panels installed on the school and hostel buildings. In the coming years, all other campuses will be powered by renewable energy too.

SRI SATHYA SAI LOKA SEVA **HEALTH CENTRE**

The Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Health Centre has been in existence since 1979 at Sathya Sai Grama, Muddenahalli, Chikkaballapur. It is run by the Sri Sathya Sai Loka Seva Trust. With its staff of ten caregivers, the centre treats patients free of cost for common ailments. On an average, the able team of doctors see about 1,000 walk-ins each week.

To reach out to a wider patient base, the Centre also conducts medical camps, takes health care to the villagers' doorsteps and pays periodic visits to

government schools in the vicinity. At the camps, children and adults are screened and treated for disorders and ailments.

The Centre also works collaboratively with reputed medical colleges and hospitals such as M.S.Ramaiah Medical College, M.S.Ramaiah Dental College, R.V. Dental college and Dhristi Ophthalmic Unit and Sri Venkateshwara College of Dental Sciences.

SRI SATHYA SAI SARLA MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

This general hospital will be dedicated to improving the health of villagers, particularly women and children. The 30,000 square feet hospital will be built in two phases to house all departments pertaining to general health and overall well-being.



Nourishing the Nation through Nutrition

FROM THE **DESK OF THE CHAIRPERSON**

The simplest way to secure a healthy future of the nation is to invest in our children now. But sadly, child malnutrition is a haunting reality for us. At Annapoorna, we work towards alleviating hunger and undernourishment in rural and underprivileged school-going children by providing them with a nutritious breakfast.

Providing breakfast may be a simple concept but it has a far-reaching impact. Since we started, we have been a fortunate witness to the transformative power of the indispensable breakfast. Higher attendance, lower dropout rates, improved health parameters, marked increase in academic performance and attentiveness - and the list goes on. But the most gratifying impact of the breakfast programme has been the transformation it has kindled in these children. Inspired by the volunteers and their dedication, the children have on multiple occasions expressed their desire to pay it forward to the society when they grow up. While our reach has grown tremendously over the years, I reckon it is the inner transformation, in both the children and us, that's our biggest achievement.

While our work spans across nutrition, health, water and sanitation, the unifying focus remains the child's well-being. Setting a child on a holistic path with good daily nutrition and the ability to attend and succeed in school is our collective social responsibility, and one, which will go a long way in nation building.



THE ANNAPOORNA **BREAKFAST PROGRAMME**

India is home to the largest number of children in the world. But unfortunately, not all our children have access to well-balanced and nutritious food. The Annapoorna breakfast programme was conceived as a solution to this. In July 2012, a handful of individuals came together and started the programme by serving breakfast to about 50 children at a school in Doddabele, near Kengeri,


Bangalore. Over the years, more schools and children were added to the breakfast chain.

Today, more than 200 Annapoorna volunteers serve freshly-cooked breakfast to more than 22,000 children every day across its many centres spread all over the country.



SRI SATHYA SAI ANNAPOORNA TRUST

The Sri Sathya Sai Annapoorna Trust was set up in November 2015. A charitable trust, headquartered in Sathya Sai Grama in Muddenahalli, it primarily oversees all the activities and obligations of the breakfast and allied programmes.



A SCIENTIFIC APPROACH **TO BREAKFAST**

Our breakfast menus are prepared under the guidance of our expert nutritionists' panel and are designed to meet the calorie requirements of growing children. It contains a variety of foods, such as, milk, whole grains, proteins, and fruits and vegetables, to help keep students energetic and ready to learn until lunchtime.

The entire process from planning the menu to sourcing of vegetables and milk, to training of the cooks is meticulously planned to ensure that the breakfast is wholesome in its nutrition quotient and meets the quality standards and cost checks. It is also scientifically calibrated with the prescribed percentages of carbohydrates, proteins, and fibre components, as suggested by nutritionists.



Annapoorna menus are planned to meet the typical nutrition gap of growing children in rural India. They are designed to appease the children's palates as well as achieve a basic blend of nutrients quintessential for their overall growth and development.

The entire week's offering put together meets roughly about 20-30 percent of the weekly nutrition requirement of a school-going child. This is in keeping with the standard norms worldwide.

QUALITY CHECK AND CONTROL

A check on quality of ingredients is maintained by working closely with the local vendors from whom milk, vegetables and fruits are sourced. This helps to positively engage the villagers in the programme and empower them economically, while keeping a tab on overall costs.

Cooks, who are the backbone of the entire programme are carefully selected to ensure that the breakfast not only meets the nutrition needs of the young bodies, it satisfies their little taste buds too.





FOCUS ON WELL-ROUNDED **EACH CHILD**

Annapoorna started out as a breakfast only initiative. But over the years expanded its scope to include health, education, water and sanitation in its ambit to address children's overall well-being and health in a holistic way.



My second daughter, Sanjana, was suffering from severe anaemia. But after she started receiving regular and healthy breakfast in centre, her health has improved a lot. The children are served healthful breakfast every day, with a good mix of fruits, vegetables and milk, rich in protein and vitamins. And if the little children have trouble eating on their own, the volunteers step in, feeding them with their own hands.


HEALTHCARE

Annapoorna conducts regular health screening and dental camps for the children in the schools. The screening tests are designed in line with the guidelines of United Nations and aligned with the specifications of the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India.

With a focus on the 4Ds in children – Defects. Deficiencies, Diseases and Developmental Delays, we aim to contribute to the children's health through timely detection, prevention, education and medical management.

True education should enrich the heart and nourish the soul. In keeping with this spirit, the volunteers work closely with the children, parents, teachers and school authorities to ensure that the children are nourished holistically. Through story-telling, group singing and other such interactive activities, children are taught the importance of the secular and universal human values of truth, righteousness, peace, nonviolence and love.

Computer skills, spoken English lessons, environment awareness and other such useful and practical classes are also undertaken for the children after school.

We also sponsor higher education of children who show a keen interest in academics. Till date, over 40 children have received such a sponsorship.














WATER & SANITATION

Access to clean drinking water and good sanitation is a basic human right. In schools and villages that lack these basic comforts, Annapoorna executes drinking water projects and constructs toilets.

Simple and cost-effective RO water plants, biosand filters and other such solutions are developed on a need-basis in the villages. From concept to completion, the entire project is executed in a seamless and scientific manner. On completion, each family is given a smart card that enables them to receive 20 litres of potable water every day.




GAVISIDDHESHWARA SWAMY TEMPLE AND MARAMMA DEVI TEMPLE





A LIFE IN SERVICE
